Across the Atlantic- Emigrating from Merville and Derry

Across the Atlantic is a book containing short articles on the history of nineteenth and twentieth century emigration from Donegal, specifically the town of Merville and from Derry, and the shipping industry which developed in those towns hand in hand with the growth in emigration to the 'new world'.

The book is edited by Niamh Brennan (archivist, Donegal County Council) and Bernadette Walsh (archivist, Derry City Council).

Contributors are Paddy Fitzgerald at the Migration Centre, Ulster American Folk Park, Omagh; Denis Noel, Archivist of The Provincial Archives, New Brunswick, Canada; Mickey McGuinness, local historian, Derry; Bernadette Walsh, Derry City archivist; Berni Campbell, local studies librarian, Donegal County Council; Niamh Brennan, Donegal County Council archivist; Ciara Joyce, archivist; Declan Sheehan, assistant public art manager, Donegal County Council; Sean Beattie, local historian; and Brian Mitchell, local historian.

The book includes chapters on available sources for emigration in Donegal, Derry and online. It is illustrated with photographs, shipping lists, and extracts from emigrants' letters and other archives' facsimiles relating to emigration.

The book is a collaborative project between Derry City Council Archives Service and Donegal County Council Archives Service, in conjunction with Donegal County Council Libraries and Public Art Office and The Provincial Archives of New Brunswick.

The book will be published and launched on Wednesday 2nd September 2009. The project coincides with the launch of a new sculpture commemorating Menville's history of emigration, by artist Locky Morris, *The Fid- Menville Emigration Monument*.

***Across the Atlantic* is published by Donegal County Council and Derry City Council and funded by Donegal County Council.**

The book will be launched in Menville on 2nd September, 2009.

OLC Ireland Trust Fund: A New Grants Scheme for Marginalised Women

The Community Foundation for Ireland has launched a new nationwide fund, the **OLC Ireland Trust Fund**, and has called for applications from registered charities and not for profit organisations around Ireland who work with marginalised women.

The OLC Ireland Trust Fund is managed by The Community Foundation for Ireland on behalf of The Sisters of Our Lady of Charity. The Fund will endeavour to support projects that most closely respond to issues concerning addictions, prostitution, trafficking, violence and abuse of women. The goal of the fund is to provide resources, which will help educate, develop and enhance the lives and dignity of marginalised women.

This new Fund has been opened with a total of EUR 85,500 available for grant-making in 2009. It will award grants four times per year with the first closing date for applications being **March 31st 2009**.

Value Notes : Grants will be in the region of EUR 500 to EUR 5,000 except in exceptional circumstances when a maximum of EUR 10,000 will be awarded. Grants will be made for once-off projects that are not the core of ongoing activities of the organisation concerned.

The 2009 Closing dates for applications are:

- March 31st
- June 30th
- September 30th and
- December 31st.

The grants will be awarded in April, July, October and January.

**ICCL & UCD: Training Course on Equal Status Act
Access to Equality: A Training Course on the Equal Status Acts**

The Irish Council for Civil Liberties (ICCL) and the Equality Studies Centre at the UCD School of Social Justice have come together to devise an educational programme for advice givers, community workers and non-governmental organisation(NGO) representatives who work in the area of human rights and social justice. This programme will be delivered in October and November/December 2009 to 12 participants.

Format

Classes will take the form of discussion-based seminars.

Dates and Location

Classes will take place in the Library Building on the campus of University College Dublin, Belfield, Dublin 4. The course is four full days in duration, divided into blocks of two days. The first block will be run on Wednesday, 28 and Thursday, 29 October 2009. And the second part will run on Monday, 30 November and Tuesday, 1 December 2009.

Cost

The course fee for this programme is €100.00 which includes course materials and lunches for each day.

The course fee will be waived for individuals experiencing genuine financial hardship. Individuals seeking a course waiver will need to make a request to the ICCL.

The ICCL will also consider requests for assistance with childcare costs for a limited number of participants together with travel and accommodation for persons coming from outside Dublin.

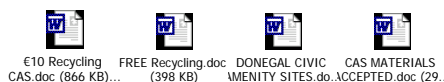

Litter Campaigns Spring Summer Clean UP Programme

Donegal County Council offer assistance to the general public every spring/summer season to clean up litter and illegally dumped waste from their local environs e.g. approach roads, local beauty spots, beaches and general public areas. It is also intended through the programme to develop a community led approach to the problem of litter and fly tipping. The programme runs from April to September.

Who Qualifies for the Programme?

Groups that may apply include the following: Bona Fide Clubs, Organisations, Associations, Environmental Groups and Tidy Towns Committees. Groups of individuals not necessarily attached to a group may also qualify for assistance provided it is a public area they are

intending to clean up. Private household clean ups will not qualify for the scheme and skips in particular will only be distributed to group led clean ups in public areas. Groups interested in organising an environmental clean up can apply for assistance through their local area office.

Bags, Gloves and Litter pickers are available at the offices below. Any groups organising a major environmental clean up can apply for a skip. They must however register and complete the application form, which is available at the main council offices in Carndonagh, Dungloe, Donegal Town, Letterkenny, Lifford and Milford.

2009 COMMUNITY COMPOSTING WORKSHOPS
Don't delay; book your composting workshop today!

In 2009, the Waste Awareness Officer plans to deliver a number of Composting Workshops to local community groups. These workshops are becoming popular and there is a lot of interest among local community groups for information on composting etc.

1/3 of our household waste is organic waste that can be composted. This can be done using a compost bin or heap and will turn food waste into rich compost that can then be used as a garden fertiliser. Diverting this food waste from your regular waste bin will also cut down on waste to landfill and waste costs for the householder.

If you are involved in the local Tidy Towns committee why not consider a composting workshop, as it will help with your next application for the Tidy Towns competition next year.

WANTED: BATTERY RECYCLING COLLECTION POINTS!

To increase the number of waste batteries that are collected for recycling, Donegal County Council is interested in hearing from any community groups that would like to become a collection point for waste batteries in their local area.

Battery Boxes will be provided to any interested groups and when boxes are full they may be brought to any Donegal County Council Civic Amenity Site, Public Service Centre or make arrangement with Mr. David Friel, Recycling Officer (074) 91 76274 or Suzanne Tinney, Waste Awareness Officer (074) 91 76276 for their recycling.

Waste Batteries

Waste Batteries must never be placed in your waste disposal or recycling bins. There is a bin for small batteries in your local store. Battery Recycling is free.

What to do with Waste Batteries:

Under the new Battery Regulations that came into effect on the 26th September 2008 waste batteries can be dropped off **FREE OF CHARGE** at any retailer supplying similar batteries and with no obligation to purchase batteries.

Retailers do not have to accept leaking batteries or more than 5kg at a time. Batteries can also be dropped off **FREE OF CHARGE** at your local Civic Amenity Site. Donegal County Council also has collection points for batteries at all the Public Service Centres.

On all new batteries there is a crossed out wheellie bin sign, this is to remind you not to put the waste battery in the ordinary bin.

7. Flight of the Earls /Imeacht na nIarlaí

Flight of the Earls Commemorative Poster Postéir Cuimhneacháin Imeacht na nIarlaí

2007 saw Donegal County Development Board and the County of Donegal commemorate this landmark event in our history. To mark this year and the landmark event that was commemorated, a limited edition of numbered Flight of the Earls/Imeacht na nIarlaí Posters has been produced.
