Dictionary of Irish Biography

One of the most exciting works published recently is the massive nine volume Dictionary of Irish Biography. This collaborative project between the Royal Irish Academy and Cambridge University Press is available in both print and online formats.

Over seven hundred contributors, including Donegal's own Helen Meehan, have devoted years of hard work and dedication to this massive project. Edited by James McGuire and James Quinn, over nine thousand prominent Irish lives are documented here. Men and women who have made an impact on Ireland and on Irish history are brought alive for contemporary readers.

Biographical subjects are drawn from all aspects of Irish life and from earliest times up to 2002. You will find saints, artists, writers, politicians and sporting icons, to name but a few. One of the most important features of the Dictionary of Irish Biography is the documentation of prominent Irish women, who have previously been somewhat overlooked,

This statement has been cemented by the conferring of the 2009 American Publishers' Award for Professional and Scholarly Excellence for best Multivolume Reference Work by the Association of American Publishers.

Congratulations !!! What an achievement. You can check it out for yourself at your local library where figures from Ireland's past have now come to life.

Edge of The Sea.

An Artists' Residency, with a Nordic dimension, at Donegal County Museum

Donegal County Council, through its Cultural Services Division, is presently participating in an innovative transnational project, entitled EDGES, with partners in Iceland and Norway.

EDGES is a co-operative effort combining cultural heritage, contemporary art and administrative arrangements, so as to strengthen local identity in three peripheral regions of the Northern Atlantic. The challenge is to devise new ways of advancing a sense of community and an appreciation of local heritage in a global context.

The project partners are Vesterålen Regional Council (Norway), East Iceland Culture Council and Donegal County Council Cultural Services.

At the core of the project are three museum-based artists's residencies, each exploring a similar Edge-related theme - The Edge of The Pier (Vesterålen), The Edge of the Sea

(Donegal) focusing on sea journeys by Donegal hermit monks and The Edge of the Imagination (East Iceland) focusing on mythical folklore and beliefs.

The artists in residence at Donegal County Museum are **Theresa Kavanagh** and **Joleen McLaughlin**. Both are accomplished traditional musicians and music composers. Joleen's instrument of choice is the Irish Harp, Theresa's speciality is the Fiddle / Violin.

Donegal County Museum staff are currently undertaking research into the history and folklore surrounding the monks of the Early Christian period (5th-9th centuries) and their connections to Donegal, Iceland and Northern Norway. This research is assisting the artists in the creation of their musical compositions. The Museum will also undertake the research for a multimedia presentation for which the composition will form the centrepiece.

Be sure to tick the "just a username, please" option at the bottom of the page. It's as easy as that. You will probably get an email to activate your username etc..
- To add a post to the Donegal Beach blog, login with you username and password and you will be able to add new post. Give your post a title and type in your blog. You can upload images by using the upload/insert icons. You can also categorise your blog based on the categories listed to the right. This makes it easier to organise all the blogs. Don't forget you can also register for National Spring Clean at www.nationalspringclean.org registration is now open! Over 505,000 volunteers took part in some 5058 events nationwide in 2009. An estimated 1,596 tonnes of litter was collected and 35% of the total amount of waste collected was recycled.

Composting workshops

In 2010, the Waste Awareness Officer will once again deliver a number of Composting Workshops to local community groups. 1/3 of our household waste is organic waste that can be composted. This can be done using a compost bin or heap and will turn food waste into rich compost that can then be used as a garden fertiliser. Diverting this food waste from your regular waste bin will also cut down on waste to landfill and waste costs for the householder.
